

Dear Friends in Jesus,

I wanted to share two important items in this space this month. First, a reminder that orange Fight for Brian wristbands are available for \$1 each in the Sunday School Room (and in several other locations in our local community). As you hopefully have already heard, the goal of this project, created and organized by Marlee Mattern, is to raise a total of \$1,500 from the sale of 1,000 wristbands and other donations above and beyond the \$1 per band. A 1/3 match has been made available to us by the Dauphin County Chapter of Thrivent Financial, which will result in \$500 additional if we can raise the \$1,500. At the request of Brian and Jodi, half of the money raised – hopefully \$750 – will be given to leukemia research (from which Brian has benefited so much), while the remaining half, plus the matching funds, will be given to the Thompson's. Since the money raised will be routed through our Local Benevolence Fund, please make checks payable to "St. John Lutheran Church" and note on your check "Fight for Brian". When you stop by the Sunday School Room, you will find an informative display, created by Marleen, that includes information on becoming a bone marrow donor (much simpler than you would imagine!). In addition, while you are purchasing your wristband, you can also prepare a "Note of Hope" for Brian. Please see Mattern or me with any questions.

Second, it is time again for Midweek Bible Study to resume – on Wednesday, October 8. We will then meet on subsequent Wednesdays through November 19, when we will take a break for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Class will be held each week from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. In a bit of a departure from our studies of individual books of the Bible, we will take a look at the beliefs and practices of other denominational branches of our Christian Family, as well as other world religions, using a resource called *Honoring Our Neighbor's Faith*. If you have ever found yourself wondering what makes us distinct from our Amish neighbors – or our United Church of Christ neighbors or our Mormon neighbors – this class will attempt to address those questions. As we did last year, we will continue this fall study during our winter study time, following the beginning of the new year. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) by Sunday, September 28.

HELP FOR HUNGRY CHILDREN IN OUR AREA

After a very successful first gathering at St. John on September 17, on Wednesday, October 1, there will be another gathering of folks from congregations in the Upper Dauphin Area School District who are interested in forming and working with a new ecumenical ministry tentatively called the *Weekend Snack Pack Program*, by which elementary school children who depend on free or reduced price school lunches would have the opportunity to receive food support for the weekend. Very tentative projections show that this hunger ministry would be possible for an annual cost per sponsored child of less than \$100, with the likelihood that space for storage and preparation of the food for distribution will be available at the elementary school. With this space in mind, the October 1 meeting will be held at the elementary school, beginning at 6:30 P.M. Especially needed will be volunteers to handle the food and financial support. IT'S TIME FOR "BLANKET SUNDAY"

On Sunday, October 5, we will enjoy a beautiful display of the blankets that have been made by the "Blanket Bunch" since last fall for Lutheran World Relief. We will include a "blessing of the blankets" and receive a special ingathering offering to help to offset the cost of shipping the blankets to wherever in the world they will be needed in the year ahead.

AND FOR A WALK IN THE WOODS!

Our annual "Walk in the Woods" is being planned for Sunday, October 5. After taking to the Susquehanna River last year, aboard the Millersburg Ferry, we will be taking to the "highway" this year, as we meet at the church at 1:30 P.M. to walk together to the farm of Randy and Sandy Paul (approximately a 2-mile fairly level walk from the church via Rakers Mill Road). Those who do not wish to walk, or who are not able physically to do so, are invited to simply drive to the Paul's, aiming to arrive at 2:15 P.M., when we will be treated to a presentation about the Paul's beekeeping operation. Following this program, we will return to the church by car, where we will conclude the afternoon with our traditional hot dog roast and food shared together, outside in the pavilion. In case of stormy weather, everything will simply be moved to the church. Please plan to bring along a snack to go with hot dogs and a container of drink to share, and sign up on the sheet on the foyer bulletin board.



Annual World Hunger ingathering Sunday October 19, 2014

Our annual World Hunger Fund Ingathering Church program will be on October 19, 2014. If you would like your specific contribution included on your year end financial statement you will need to provide either your name or envelope number on your contribution unless you are using the envelope provided in your actual envelope box.

Over the years we have assembled 4 Enterline cousins that have graciously agreed to match all world hunger offerings received during the first 3 Sundays in October on a 1 for 1 basis. Every dollar received will be doubled that Sunday.

As your World Hunger Coordinator since 1979 you have responded very generously over those years as our compilation of statistics reveal that as of 2013 we had given \$ 76,015.88. This includes Hurricane Sandy relief of \$4600 in 2012

The ELCA World Hunger program initiated in 2011 GOD'S GLOBAL BARNYARD. Early in 2014 we once again decided to go with this theme.

As we did last year when we have a final figure for Oct,2013 we will have all teens, children and interested adults come to the Sunday School room after church service. All of you will have dollars available to choose how we are going to spend that money to buy animals, fowl or farm. Bring your ideas along with maybe your parents and as a team we will make decisions on how best we can help others somewhere in God's World that are less fortunate than we are as Americans.

A handout will be available soon on what is available in God's Global Barnyard and will be distributed during Oct for your education on what's available and the cost for the animals or fowl.

Remember the world's population just in my lifetime has gone from about a 2 Billion estimate in 1950 to about 7 Billion today. Think of the strain on the planet. We Americans use about 25 to 30 percent of the world's natural resources with 5% of the population.

For many of our past years we had a very generous but silent member, Marie Casner who constantly gave for our world hunger programs. We had decided early in the year to honor and remember. Marie during the year of 2014, and specifically the month of October. From all of us to 'Marie' we once again give you a Great Big Thank You, as Christ's earthly servant for a job well done.

St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting Minutes July 13, 2014

The Council Meeting was called to order by President Jim Watson.

Pastor Tom offered devotions.

Present – James Bullock, Jamie Doyle, Carol Hassinger, Lorraine Henninger, Roy Henry, Ken Koller, Sandra Lamenza, Jeff Lehman, Sandra Shade, Cheryl Shadle, Jim Watson and Pastor Tom

Excused Absences —Eric Mattern

Motion by Jim Bullock, 2nd by Cheryl Shadle to accept May Council minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

New Business:

Pastor Beth George from Synod Council discussed the upcoming "Always Being Made New" ELCA campaign designed to create endowment to provide stability for ministry that we do. The Malaria campaign is folded into this. From the 14 listening posts that were held (one of which was held here, at St. John), a list of items to work on was developed. Bishop Dunlop has made many of the suggested changes with calls & communications. Communications go to Pastors of member churches. Individual members can go to synod website & sign up of Carings & Sharings newsletter email. Campaign approve to raise \$5.5 million over next 5 years and ½ is for church wide improvements with the other ½ going to improve things within our own synod - \$2.75 million stays here (\$1 million seeding for the camping campaign property purchase, \$750,000 for Bishops congregational mission fund, \$100,000 for disaster relief within synod, \$500,000 for hunger initiatives, \$150,000 for youth & young adult ministry, etc.)

Establishing synodically authorized worship communities (ie. Deaf community, homeless community, new groups)

Redevelopment work with struggling congregations with the goal of equipping 24 new leaders with training.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

Motion by Carol Hassinger, 2nd by Ken Koller to make annual gift to Berrysburg Fire Company in the same amount as last year. Motion passed unanimously.

Thank you received from Seminary for our gift towards Crossroads campaign.

Request from Romberger reunion, Sue Romberger asked if they could continue using pavilion since John and Marge are gone. They feel very connected to our church. Council agreed as long as Sue Romberger contacts Pastor Tom to schedule each year.

Request from sexton- their electric range is dying and they would like to switch to propane (at their own expense). Council agreed to allow.

Water report for the quarter came back fine.

Policy (Worship & Music) to only celebrate member weddings or those closely related to a member. Helen Henninger's niece, Erin Minnich, would like to wed here. Council was agreeable.

A prayer shawl was given to Pastor Susan Halverstat who is moving to Williamsport.

Sept 7th is 2nd Annual "God's Work, Our Hands Day" and members of the ELCA and encourages to be visible doing God's work in their community. Council will consider potential projects.
