## A Letter from The Pastor.....

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Have you ever thought that you would like to know more about Martin Luther and what it means to be a Lutheran Christian? Well, here is your opportunity! As we mark the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation on October 31 (the date in the year 1517 when Martin Luther is credited with "going public" with his famous 95 Theses, the event which, more than any other, unleashed those voices and forces of reform) Midweek Bible Study this fall and winter will conclude a year-long focus on Martin Luther and the Reformation with a look at both Luther's life and the work for which (except for those 95 Theses themselves) he is perhaps best remembered – The Small Catechism. Our study will begin on Wednesday, October 11, with something new and different – a graphic novel commissioned especially for this 500th Anniversary year, titled *Papa Luther*, by which we will learn about Martin Luther's life from the perspective of his children, Hans and Magda. We will then turn to another brand new 500th Anniversary resource called By Heart: Conversations with Martin Luther's Small Catechism. This richly illustrated resource, complete with companion DVD, will guide our exploration of Luther's guide to the most important aspects of our Christian Faith. We will meet each Wednesday from 6:30 to 8:00 P.M. through November 15, when we will take a break for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Then, as we have done the past several years, we will continue our fall study during our winter study time, following the beginning of the new year. No previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with me) by Sunday, October 1.

And, speaking of learning more about Martin Luther, please don't forget about the opportunity that you will have to gather with other Lutheran Christians from our Upper Dauphin Conference at 5:00 P.M. on Sunday, October 22, at the Colonnade Theater in Millersburg for a free showing of the new movie *Martin Luther: The Idea That Changed the World*. This will also be an opportunity to see the brand new Upper Dauphin Conference Reformation 500th Anniversary Quilt that was assembled, largely at our church, by quilters from the different congregations of our conference. Read on in this *Epistle* for more details about the  $22^{\rm nd}$ .

May the beginning of the Season of Autumn be a time of blessing and thanksgiving for you and yours!

## Reformation Anniversary Celebration



There was a show of community workmanship and a devotion to the Lutheran faith at work as the new year began in our Upper Dauphin Conference. The Lutheran women took on the project of making a 500th Anniversary Quilt.

In February of 2017 Linda Long of Emanuel Lutheran Church in Williamstown called for a meeting of ladies in the Upper Dauphin Conference of the Lower Susquehanna Synod area. She was so surprised when about twenty ladies showed interest in putting a quilt together for our Reformation Anniversary Celebration. Linda's words were , "I've called for many meetings but I've never had more than two people to show up. Now I know what to do; I call for a quilters meeting."

The ladies worked on what to include on the quilt in Martin Luther's memory as well as how to have their churches recognized. They agreed the quilt had to identify Luther, his well known hymn, A Mighty Fortress, his strength - Katie Luther, and his best known thought, as well as the best colors to use with it. So they each went back to their churches to explain what was needed from them and about their churches. Every square was 11 X 11 and

whatever was put on the square had to fit in a finished 10 X 10 inch square. These ladies worked hard at their projects and it was done with enough time for the quilter to do her work. The squares that had the Luther Rose and Hearts on them were hand sewn by Carol Lutz of Emanuel Church also.

As each group worked on the project, things came together and formed a beautiful quilt top. Sheila Shaw of Norma B Creations in Halifax will be doing the quilting for the ladies on a long-arm quilting machine.

It was wonderful to see all these ladies work together in a project that was dear to each of their hearts. The work will be recognized by the public at the Cinema Center in Millersburg, Pennsylvania on October 22 as the film about "Martin Luther - The Idea That Changed the World" will be shown. It will then be on display at each of the ELCA Churches in the Upper Dauphin Conference for a month at a time. It is also scheduled to then be on display at Synod Assembly in June of 2018. From there it will go the Synod Offices for their choice of display.
