ST. JOHN'S EPISTLE

Dear Friends in Jesus,

The month of October, with educational pursuits of all kinds back in full swing, is a really good time to take stock of your own continuing growth and education in the Faith. We often think of this in terms of young persons (who <u>are</u> well-served here at St. John with Miss Laurie's weekly SON-Day Celebration and monthly Celebration Club for our youngest members, a creative Youth Sunday School gathering with Matt & Olivia Williard upstairs in our *Youth Zone*, and my weekly Confirmation Class for those preparing for Affirmation of Baptism), but I am especially referring to all of us post-high school adults. Too often, I'm afraid, we tend to think of Christian Education as something that ends when we "graduate" from confirmation class around about 9th Grade, having learned by then all that we need, but nothing could be further from the truth.

(If you doubt me on this, you can do a quick two-question self-assessment. Simply ask yourself: 1. When a Jehovah's Witness or a Mormon appears at my door, do I feel competent giving my own testimony by sharing with them what I as a Lutheran Christian believe... or does the thought of standing toe to toe with them cause me to cower behind the closed door in fear and intimidation? And 2. When a friend or relative who is active in a "fundamentalist" or "pentecostal" congregation sends something my way purporting to give THE Christian view on one of the hot topics of our time, do I feel competent in evaluating its biblical truth (or lack thereof) and discussing it with them... or do I simply see a couple of biblical citations that I don't recognize and figure "Oh, if they're quoting the Bible it must be so"?)

Assuming you see the potential for continually growing in your faith understandings, as we all need to do (including we pastors by the way), please let me commend to you **three** very good places to begin. First, your own daily plan of Bible reading. If you are looking for a starting point, our congregational family provides two very usable tools in this regard – first the *Christ in Our Home* quarterly devotional booklets and second the "Preparing for Next Week" section at the bottom of the back page of our weekly *Celebrate* bulletin inserts, which has a nice selection of varied daily readings. Or, if you feel ready for a bigger biblical adventure like reading through the Old Testament or the New Testament or the entire Bible in a year, there are many places to find reading plans that will get you there by reading larger chunks of the Bible each day (please contact me if you can't find a plan like this and I will fix you up).



Since our own personal daily Bible reading often seems to raise more questions than it answers, coming together with other sisters and brothers in the faith on Sunday mornings to share in Bible study is the **second** very important step to take. A vibrant adult class led by a rotating team of fellow biblical students gathers each week at 9:00am upstairs, starting with a very brief opening (which includes a chance to share joys and concerns, pray, and do a bit of singing). For part of the year a second more topical study will also be available on Sunday mornings for post-high school adults – watch for more news about this study getting together after the Christmas holidays. No one is ever forced to share or speak out loud – you can participate at your own pace!

And then <u>finally</u>, on Wednesday evenings in the fall, winter, and spring, I lead a 1½-hour long study from 6:30 to 8:30pm downstairs in the conference room. Our fall study, which will get underway on October 9, will take us through *The Letter to the Hebrews*, a New Testament book which is quite unfamiliar to most of us but whose opening words are so important to the story of Jesus that they have a long tradition of always being read in worship on Christmas Day. Here again you don't need to have any previous experience with Bible studies to take part and you can participate out loud as much or as little as is comfortable for you – absolutely no pressure! So that I can order the correct number of study books for our time together, please register in advance (by simply emailing, calling or speaking with me) no later than Tuesday, October 1.

Please don't hesitate to contact me about any or all of the above. And make this a year to grow!
