

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

As I write these lines, we have just returned to inside worship at our "non-summer" starting time of 10:15am. At the risk of confusing things (just as we are starting to get used to a new Sunday morning "routine") by already talking about a change in that routine, I'm very excited to tell you about something we are trying for the first time on Sunday morning, October 8. On that morning, following our regular Faith Formation activities for all ages inside at 9:00am, we will head outside to the pavilion for just one more time of outdoor worship at 10:15am. The reason we will be headed outside for worship one more time is so that our animal friends and family members can join us that morning for worship, as we ask God's particular blessing upon each of them! Yup, you heard that right – at 10:15am on Sunday, October 8, I am hoping that we will have a wonderful gathering in the pavilion of our "normal" eager congregational family members accompanied by the animals they love, of all sizes and shapes, the more the merrier.

Those who have been a part of the St. John Family for a longer time will likely remember that, for a few years in the early 2000's, we held a separate time for the Blessing of the Animals on a Sunday afternoon in early October. This eventually ended as it became ever harder to commit to that separate gathering time on what is often a busy family day in a particularly busy time of the year. So, my hope this year (and going forward) is that making the Blessing of the Animals a part of our regular Sunday morning worship time will enable more people and more animals to more easily take part. Because we all know that not all animals "play well together", the sextons and I will make sure that our chairs are more widely-spaced and everyone will have the option of bringing along their own chair and spacing themselves where it might seem most comfortable and doable. By gathering in the pavilion and thereby having all of the surrounding space to use as well, there is room and space even for larger animals like horses – yes, horses and other large animals too!!

Now, why October 8/early October you ask? Good question! This dating comes from the fact that St. Francis of Assisi is commemorated on October 4 each year, the date of his death in the year 1226. Francis is remembered and celebrated amongst Christians for many reasons, but one of those is his reputation as someone who stressed our brotherhood and sisterhood with all animals and with all of God's Creation. It is even said that it was Francis who began the idea of the "nativity scene" as a Christmas thing – thereby teaching others about the important presence of the "non-humans" at the time and place of Jesus' birth. So, we are gathering on a Sunday nearby to that important date of October 4.

In closing, I really mean all of the above – really!! I'm hoping to see lots of animals of many different kinds as we come together on October 8, including <u>yours!!</u> You will be able to get up and move around as may be helpful and, if it should feel helpful to have your animal family member spend part of the time back in the car for any reason, that too is no problem – but please don't feel as if you have to do this! And please don't feel like your animal will look less well-behaved than the next one. Yoshi, our beloved dog who died four years ago now – on October 4 ironically enough – really didn't do well with other dogs, maybe having to do with the rough start he had in life as an abandoned and then rescued animal. No one is going to be judging you or your animal(s) on October 8. Simply do what you need to do to make it comfortable for all of you, and come and worship together!



We opened the convention with the business of elections. Peggi Norman has been re-elected to the position of president. We are still in need of a treasurer, but Chris Todd has been appointed to this position till our next convention. We unfortunately lost our former treasurer to the death of Kathy Kauffman. New members to the board are Sally Hagy, Donna Griefzu and Fay Nichols. The secretary and vice-president are still in office as well as other board members.

Friday evening's service was with The Rev. Marissa Becklin, who was also our convention chaplain. Her reflection was on John 10:11-26. It was a very moving service. We also had a question and answer session with Bishop James Dunlop. This was very interesting. He told us about the change in the church and how we will be affected. Saturday morning started with a worship service with the Bishop also. His service was on John 10:1-10 & 27-30. He spoke about the lost sheep and how we must all work together to praise God in our daily lives.

We had two workshops to attend. One was "Living Smaller-Living in Abundance" and the other was "Sustaining Women of the ELCA for Future Generations". Both were very good workshops. Minutes: Motion by Joshua Paul to accept the May 2023 minutes as read. Second by Sandra Lamenza. Motion approved unanimously.

Reception of Petitions and Communications:

- Fay Nichols shared that the Women of the ELCA wants to do a special offering of food and food gift cards for the Food Drive at the Synodical Women's Gathering to benefit the food pantry at United Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg. Motion by Ty Troutman to promote the food drive. 2nd by Gail Billow. Motion passed unanimously.
- When the barn was cleaned out in June, the tables were disassembled and disposed of. We no longer have tables to lend out. Motion was made not to allow the loaning of pavilion tables was made by Sandra Lamenza. 2nd by Christie Kahler. Motion passed unanimously.
- September 10th will be Fall Celebration Sunday with an outdoor service in the pavilion at 9:30 with a blessing of the backpacks and devices, to be followed by a Sundae Bar and fellowship.
- The pit toilets were pumped out by Kissy's Septic. Kissy's found that there was trash thrown into the toilets.
- Strawberry Festival Fund Donations proposed:
 - \$100 to the Elizabethville Library Yearly Book Drive
 - \$500 gift to the Berrysburg Fire Company for the yearly drive
 - \$1000 to the Snack Pack Program at UDA Elementary School.
 Motion to approve the donations made by Sandra Lamenza. 2nd by Jeff Lehman.
 Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Motion to accept Pastor Tom's report was made by Josh Paul. 2nd by Courtney Foreman. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion to accept Miss Laurie's report by Sandra Lamenza. 2nd by Sheila Barder. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Pastor provided a summary. Motion to accept the treasurer's report by Ty Troutman. 2nd by Christie Kahler. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: The siding on the Sexton house will be repaired tomorrow. A special meeting will be held next Sunday to discuss the status of the trees.

Finance Committee: No report.

Worship and Music:

- The Elevator Usher is to ride up and down the elevator with members/guests.
- Starting this Fall we will offer the Common Cup on special holidays, sharing of the Peace, and signing cards for those that are hospitalized all as done prior to COVID.

- Pastor Tom is proposing doing a blessing of the animals on the Sunday closest to October 4th annually. This service will be held in the pavilion each year (October 8th this year).
- We will begin having the acolytes extinguish the candles during the postlude.

Cemetery Committee: Held the walk-through with Elizabethville Monument Company as planned. Approximately \$5,000 worth of damage noted.

Faith Formation: A VBS planning meeting was held two weeks ago.

Mutual Ministry: Met this morning. Discussed Living Lutheran magazine.

Executive: No report.

Nominating: Will start compiling a list of candidates soon.

History and Archive: No report.

Bell Ringing: No report.

Youth Group: Had outside game night. Tshirt sale is happening now. Next meeting will be in September.

Strawberry Festival Committee: Wrap up meeting was held. The first planning meeting for next year's festival will be held Monday, March 11th at 7 PM. Next year's Strawberry Festival will be held on Wednesday, June 12, 2024.
