### Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Just before writing these lines, I was putting some finishing touches on the calendar that is also a part of this *St. John's Epistle* and, as I looked it over, I was struck by how very "normal" the calendar looks – the most "normal" calendar we've had as a congregational family since February of 2020 in fact...

It once again speaks of a "Blanket Bunch" making those wonderful blankets for Lutheran World Relief on Monday mornings and of a Senior Choir coming together to make inspiring music on Tuesday evenings...

And it shows our Sunday morning life together taking place in-person in the historic building which is our congregational family home, now newly and beautifully-restored (and with an enhanced Zoom worship participation option available for those who cannot for any reason be here in person at any time), all thanks to the completion of our *St. John Restoration 250* project (although the <u>funding</u> of that project as yet remains to be completed – to that end you'll see a pledge/giving form included later in this *Epistle*).

What isn't readily visible in the calendar is that we are actively moving, beginning this month, toward our "new normal" when it comes to worship and other Sunday morning activities, with Acolytes once again acolyting, Ushers once again ushering, Greeters once again greeting, and our worship liturgy looking and sounding very much as it did prior to March of 2020.

It isn't that COVID infections are now a thing of the past, far from it and likely never to be so! Instead, we seem to be moving steadily from a state of COVID <u>pan</u>demic, with widespread suffering and death, to a place where the virus is <u>en</u>demic – a reality of our world that it would be very unwise to ignore

(think the annual return of the flu)

but for which we now have in place common-sense precautions and protections

(think that annual flu shot – now with an annual COVID booster as well – and pausing hand-shaking when it gets particularly-bad – now with masks and additional distancing sometimes thrown in for good measure)

all of which will help us to keep right on with our lives and the work God has given us to do, barring any unexpectedly dire turns.

We won't have all of the "new normal" in effect right away as of October 2. Instead, it will be more of a gradual phasing in over the next couple of months. And, through it all, I would ask your help with bringing to the process your patience and your good humor and your love in Jesus, along with your constructive ideas! (It is, after all, a "new normal" – not an automatic return to exactly what went on prior to March of 2020.) It is an exciting time – very much so – even as we realize (as the COVID years reminded us so vividly) that we aren't in control of what is to come and so all of our plans are tentative.

It's an adventure, living into God's Future. I'm really looking forward to continuing to share that adventure with you as a part of this wonderful congregational family which is St. John, the Hill Church!

# **Midweek Bible Study**

Our autumn session of Midweek Bible Study will get underway on Wednesday, October 12 and run for six weeks, meeting each week from 6:30 to 8:00pm and wrapping up in time for Thanksgiving Eve, Advent, and Christmas. Pending COVID developments, we will plan to meet in-person at the church, with the option for participants who would prefer to do so to "Zoom in". Our topic this fall will be Signs and Wonders: A Beginner's Guide to the Miracles of Jesus by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine, in which she explores selected miracles of Jesus (such as the Raising of Lazarus) in their historical and theological context, looking at how past witnesses would have understood the events as well as how we today can draw meaning from Jesus's words and actions. Celebrated New Testament professor and scholar Dr Amy-Jill "AJ" Levine was the first Jewish person to teach New Testament at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and describes herself as "an unorthodox member of an Orthodox synagogue and a Yankee Jewish feminist who until 2021 taught New Testament in a Christian divinity school (Vanderbilt) in the buckle of the Bible Belt". As always with these studies, no previous Bible study experience is required – only an interest and enthusiasm to study, reflect on, and (if and when you are comfortable doing so) discuss God's Word together! So that the correct number of study books can be ordered for our study, please register in advance (by speaking with Pastor Tom) by the end of the morning on Sunday, October 2.
