On the Sunday following Labor Day, **Sunday**, **September 13**, we really turn the corner from summer to fall in our congregational family life. This happens first of all in our timing that morning, as Sunday School returns to its 9:00 A.M. beginning time, followed by worship at 10:15 A.M.

Youth Group (designed for all congregational youth <u>as well as their friends</u>, in Grades 6-12) will get back underway with a poolside gathering at the home of Dennis & Mary Ann Smeltz from 2:00 to 5:00 P.M. while, at 6:00 P.M., following Congregational Council, Women's Group will gather in the Sunday School Room.

May the remaining days of summer be good and blessed ones for you. And may our wondrous God lead us toward ever greater faithfulness and new and wonderful opportunities to serve, as the seasons turn!

CONFIRMATION CLASS RESUMES

On Sunday morning, September 20, those baptized members of St. John who are in at least 7th Grade and who have not yet been confirmed will begin a new year of study with Pastor Tom. The focus this year will be a look at what it means to be a <u>Christian</u> who is also a <u>Lutheran</u> – taking in the story of how we have come to be <u>Lutheran Christians</u> in the first place, as well as what that identity means for our daily lives. Two of our young members are in their second of two years of study, leading toward their Confirmation next year on the Day of Pentecost. Approximately six other young persons will begin a first year of study.

On the fourth Sunday of September, September 27, we will observe our annual Festival of Harvest Home. On that day, everyone attending worship is encouraged to bring non-perishable food items (canned goods must be purchased—home canned foods are still not able to be accepted) or fresh produce for the decorating of the chancel and then delivery to the food pantry at the Upper Dauphin Human Services Center in Elizabethville.

TALLYING THE BERRIES...

As we look back on our Annual Strawberry Festival, held on a spectacularly-beautiful Wednesday, June 10, record financial results reflect a total count of persons attending that was also the highest ever in the past several years that we have been keeping track. Gross receipts for the day were \$19,164.71, up about \$3,300 from a very stormy 2014, while total expenses of \$4,682.09 were actually about \$700 lower than in 2014, thanks to a great many donations of all kinds. The resulting record net proceeds of \$14,482.62 were added to the "Bicentennial"/Local Benevolence Fund. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way to make the Strawberry Festival another wonderful success! A special thank you to Thrivent Financial for those matching funds received again this year.

OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING - AS OF JUNE 30

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) At the half-way point in the year, with 26 of 52 Sundays behind us as of June 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent \$70,628 out of our total 2015 budget of \$141,256. We have actually received \$68,299 in offerings and other income, placing us behind budget by \$2,329. (This places us in the top half of giving compared to budget results for the past 15 years, and is especially nice to note following our worst-ever results back as of the end of February!) Our expenses as of the end of June total \$66,974 and are \$3,654 under budget. Since we have spent less than we have taken in, we are running a surplus of \$1,325 as of June 30. The bottom line is that our ministry here together continues to be very blessed, especially in light of the continued struggles of our economy!

As to our benevolence offerings which we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of June 30, we would have received and forwarded half, or \$6,000, out of our total 2015 commitment of \$12,000. As of June 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of \$5,456, meaning that we are **slightly behind** our commitment by \$544. We will want to be sure to close this gap as the year goes along.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Pastor Tom or any member of Council!


