# A Letter from The Pastor.....

Dear Friends in Jesus,

September is a month of transition, from the things of summer to the things of the coming autumn, and our congregational family life is no exception. Much too soon it seems for many of us, we gather for our final outdoor worship experience on the Sunday of Labor Day weekend, September 2. I would like to use the rest of my letter this month to highlight the Sunday schedule changes which take place in the two weeks following Labor Day.

Our schedule on the Sunday following Labor Day (September 9) will again this year be a kind of mixture of summer and autumn. From 8:45 to 9:15 A.M., I will lead a combined Adult Sunday School Class downstairs in the conference room. Our 9:30 A.M. worship, also on our summer schedule, will be a "SONDay Celebration" worship, featuring a time of sharing from our crew which attended the National Youth Gathering in Houston, TX back at the end of June and also including a Sunny Sermon by Miss Laurie, music by the Celebration Choir, and our Annual Blessing of the Backpacks led by me (for which all students – Preschool through Grade 12 – are asked to bring along their school backpacks for a time of recognition, blessing, and prayer, as a new school year gets underway). As has become our annual custom, when our worship ends at 10:30 A.M., it will be time to head out for our congregational outing to Knoebel's, where we have a pavilion set aside for our use and where everyone attending will gather with their covered dish and container of drink for sharing to join in lunch together, followed by plenty of time for riding. (Our younger members will have some ride tickets provided, through the recent Subway card fundraiser.)

# Our Faith Active in Our Financial Giving

In recent years, Congregational Council has asked that we all periodically receive an update in the *Epistle* about how we are doing in meeting our ministry commitments adopted in our annual budget.

Regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is the fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With 25 of 52 Sundays behind us as of June 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received <u>\$73,764</u> out of our total 2018 budget. Adjusting for the effects of some lump-sum gifts at the beginning of the year, we have **actually received <u>\$71,108</u>** in offerings and other income, meaning we are **short of our goal by <u>\$2,656</u>**. This amount of shortfall is a very typical result at this point in the year.

As to the Children & Youth Ministry Fund, through which Miss Laurie's ministry with us is being funded, we have **received** §8,285 in offerings and Thrivent Choice Dollars as of the end of June (again adjusting for some lump-sum gifts at the beginning of the year) which, while not quite enough money to completely cover our expenditures, is still a bit over §4,000 ahead of where we projected we might be in our giving at this point in this second year of ministry together (which is very important because we will need to continue to grow together in order to fully cover expenditures in coming years as planned, without the help of interest from our Memorials Account).

Finally, as to the gifts we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of June 30, we would have received and forwarded <u>\$5,769</u> out of our total 2018 commitment of \$12,000. As of June 30, we have **actually** received and shared a total of <u>\$7,213</u>, meaning that we are **ahead of** our commitment by <u>\$1,444</u>.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and for your financial stewardship. Again, please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Treasurer Jamie Doyle, Pastor Tom or any member of Council!
