

## Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

The following poem, **Do It Anyway**, is many times spoken of as having been written by Mother Teresa prior to her 1997 death. However, most sources now say that it is actually a paraphrasing of an earlier work by an American named Kent Keith, called **The Paradoxical Commandments**. What everyone appears to agree on is that these words were displayed prominently by Mother Teresa in at least one of the Calcutta homes for orphaned children administered by her and by her religious order, The Missionaries of Charity.

When someone mentions Mother Teresa, what tends to come to mind is someone who is/was literally "holier than thou", spending her life living amongst and caring for the poorest of the poor and the sickest of the sick in a city home to unspeakable desperation. In other words, what comes to mind is someone so unlike you and me as to have nothing in common with the likes of us, being the mixture of saint and sinner that we know ourselves to be.

How refreshing then to know that, as has been seen in her journals and other private writings since her death, Mother Teresa was in fact a Child of God in all the complexity that comes with that relationship – someone who struggled profoundly with holding onto her faith in God in the midst of so much suffering, someone with notable shortcomings as well as well-known strengths, someone with critics as well as admirers, someone in short who turns out to have a great deal in common with the likes of you and me. And so, how much more meaningful it is that, instead of writing and posting the following words as some kind of faith "expert", it may very well be the case that Mother Teresa came across these words and latched onto them and posted them as a source of hope and inspiration for her own times of struggle...

People are often unreasonable, illogical, and self-centered;

Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives;

Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some false friends and some true enemies;

Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and frank, people may cheat you;

Be honest and frank anyway.

What you spend years building, someone could destroy overnight;

Build anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, they may be jealous;
Be happy anyway.

The good you do today, people will often forget tomorrow;
Do good anyway.

Give the world the best you have, and it may never be enough;
Give the world the best you've got anyway.

You see, in the final analysis, it is between you and God;
It was never between you and them anyway.

And so, may they still be a source of hope and inspiration for you and for me as we make the transition from summer to fall and face the challenges which lie ahead!

# **Strawberry Festival**

As we look back on our Annual Strawberry Festival, held June 7 here on The Hill, we were truly blessed to have a record turnout, leading to, as reported during worship on July 23, record total receipts for the day of \$29,142.09. (Note that these record receipts also got a great boost from your very generous donations toward the sponsorship of Festival items.) Our total expenses of \$14,116.37 were also higher than in previous years, with some higher costs, but also because we invested more in quality entertainment for our young persons and also again added some equipment to continue fine tuning how we organize and carry out the Festival. The result was our second highest net proceeds ever of \$15,025.72, which were added to the "Bicentennial"/Local Benevolence Fund. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way to make the Strawberry Festival another wonderful success!

Looking ahead to 2024: Please mark your family calendars for next year's Festival, already scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 12</u>. Also, the first planning meeting for next year's Festival, open to all interested persons, will be held on Monday, March 11, beginning at 7:00 P.M. at the church.
