Dear Friends in Jesus,


A couple of folks asked me about further/again sharing the following historical reflection which I wrote for one of my recent congregational family emails. Here it is:

As I've mentioned to many of you along the way, as an avid history buff, I have become a great admirer over the years of both President Abraham Lincoln and President Franklin Roosevelt, both of whom had their own obvious imperfections and contradictions, while at the same time setting the gold standard for what it means to be a leader. I've come to find that anyone who spends any time at all reading about President Roosevelt also inevitably ends up spending quite a bit of time with Winston Churchill, the British Prime Minister with whom President Roosevelt shared an extremely productive and personally warm relationship as world leaders during the global crisis that was World War II.

And so it was that, just this week, I was reading about a speech that Churchill delivered to the House of Commons on June 18, 1940. As he spoke, France was just days away from officially surrendering to Adolf Hitler and his Nazi forces, which meant that Great Britain now stood alone before the German onslaught, with only the all-too-narrow waters of the English Channel separating England from the German war machine. (At this point, there was little that President Roosevelt could do to help, as the United States was still firmly on the sidelines, with the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor still almost 18 months in the future and many powerful and well-funded voices in the US saying that it was time to "put America first" and that this wasn't our problem – and furthermore that maybe Hitler and the Nazis weren't such bad guys after all, as German diplomatic personnel within our country were working hard behind the scenes to convince Americans that all of the negativity about Hitler was actually just so much "fake news".)

To prepare the people of Great Britain for the German invasion that now seemed almost certain to come, and with many people around him suggesting that maybe now was the time to make peace with Hitler and the Nazis, Churchill spoke of what was at stake, warning that, if Great Britain fell, the world – including eventually the United States – would descend into a new and sinister "Dark Age". He then ended with words still quoted – albeit sometimes incorrectly – *Let us therefore brace ourselves to our duties, and so bear ourselves that, if the British Empire and its Commonwealth last for a thousand years, men will say, 'This was their finest hour.'* 

That got me thinking – what will generations yet to come see and say about <u>us</u> when they one day look back upon this time of COVID-19 pandemic? It seems certain that this will indeed be "one for the books" – including a new St. John congregational history ten years or so down the road, when our 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary will be celebrated. What will they see looking back?



What will they say about us? As Prime Minister Churchill spoke there on the floor of the House, the people of Great Britain were already tired of living with wars and rumors of wars, with no end in sight. So much was unknown – almost nothing was certain. It would have been so easy to give up, to give in to their worst instincts of fear and selfishness, to take the low and seemingly easier road, to turn against each other, but the Prime Minister reminded them that the one thing they could control in the midst of so much uncontrollable uncertainty – maybe the only thing – was their own attitude and conduct. They could "brace themselves to their duties", come what may – or not.

I firmly believe that Jesus is calling you and me to "brace ourselves to our duties" of being Gospel people and so conduct ourselves that, whatever may be yet to come in this time of COVID-19, ten (if not a thousand) years from now, in a congregational history yet to be written, people will look back and be able to say that this was (if not our finest) a very good and faithful hour for the St. John Congregational Family, and that we acquitted ourselves as good and faithful servants of Jesus, instead of going with our worst instincts of fear and selfishness, taking the low and seemingly easier road, turning against each other as is too often happening in our larger society. It is as true right here today as it was on June 18, 1940 – the one thing we can control in the midst of so much uncontrollable uncertainty maybe the only thing – is our own attitude and conduct. We can choose to "brace ourselves to our duties" of doing all that we can to show Jesus' love for our neighbors near and far, come what may - or not...

As I also said in that email, perhaps the most critical way we can go about "bracing ourselves" is by making it a top priority to continue to come together as a congregational family on Sunday mornings. You will note in our September calendar that, as I write these lines in mid-August, our Sunday morning schedule for September 20 and following Sundays is still being prayerfully sorted out by our Congregational Council. Please stay tuned for those details, which will of course be widely and frequently shared in the weeks to come!

## Confirmation Class scheduled to begin...

On Sunday morning, September 20, those baptized members of St. John who are in at least 7<sup>th</sup> Grade and who have not yet been confirmed will begin a new year of study with Pastor Tom, tentatively in-person at the church, at a time and in a downstairs space to be announced, and with each participant wearing a mask covering both nose and mouth and observing safe spacing. The focus this year will be a close-up look at the Bible, both *Old & New Testaments*, as we discuss and learn about what God is saying to us in this, God's Written Word. Three of our young members are in their second of two years of study, leading toward their Confirmation next year on the Day of Pentecost, while one other young person will begin a first year of study.

## Blessing of the Devices

During both 9:30 (on Zoom) and 11:00 (in person in the pavilion) worship on **Sunday, September 13**, Pastor Tom will again be leading what has come to be our annual "Blessing of the Backpacks", but repurposed a bit this year as a **Blessing of the Devices**. Since at least some of our Pre-School through Grade 12 students (members of the congregational family as well as friends they might invite, virtually or in-person!) will be educating from home on a laptop or other device and not carrying a backpack to school <u>and</u> since many folks of all ages will be conducting their post-high school studies and their daily work from home and/or with a greater reliance than ever before on electronic devices, <u>persons of all ages</u> are asked to present on screen (during 9:30 worship via Zoom) or to bring along with them (during 11:00 worship in-person in the pavilion) their school backpacks, phones, laptops, tablets, or any other electronic device that assists them in their daily routine as we join in a time of recognition, prayer, and blessing. There will once again be the opportunity for each participant to receive a small "keepsake" to put in their backpacks or keep with their devices as a reminder of the fact that God goes with each of them through the joys and challenges of the months to come!


Having said that, we have two events coming up for everyone to look forward to:

#### **Amazon Smiles**

If you are an Amazon.com shopper, perhaps especially in this time of pandemic, our congregation is registered with the "Amazon Smiles" program, whereby Amazon donates one half of one percent of your purchase amount to a charitable organization that you select. Please note that, to qualify, your purchase has to be made through the "smile" side of things, to which you will find a very easily identifiable link from the main part of the Amazon.com website. All monies received in this way will be automatically deposited for use in the Current Fund.

Note from Pastor Tom – Fay Nichols, who serves on the World Hunger Taskforce of our Lower Susquehanna Synod and who also helps to coordinate our congregational family world hunger response, submitted the following item just before COVID-19 became a fact of our daily lives, as we look ahead to our planned annual World Hunger Appeal In-Gathering Sunday, planned for our traditional third Sunday in October, the 18th:

## World Hunger Sunday

As we look again at our coming World Hunger plea I feel like we had a closer look at WORLD HUNGER then we would normally have. This past winter and spring gave us a new look at things. We do not realize just who is our neighbor; so I ask you: "Who is your neighbor?" Is it the family that lives across the street or maybe the folks down the road on a farm? In reality it is anyone who lives in this world. When God told us to love one another as He has loved us, He is also telling us to care for each other. We are to do what He wants; not what we want. It doesn't matter if the project is in feeding others; clothing others; giving the ability to have health care; or making sure they have a good education so they can help others. How many of you have had to drink water that is dirty or infected in some way? But I do know that your help is needed to make these changes in the lives of our neighbors. You can make the difference in the lives of others by simply helping with your donations to Lutheran World Hunger With your help we can provide clean water, thus making Malaria fade away. We can teach mother's how to raise their own food and animals to feed their families. We can give a good education to their children so they can make a difference in the future of their communities. In I Corinthians 12 we are told of the unity in diversity. The diversity of gifts but in the same spirit, the diversity of ministries but in the same Lord, and the diversity of activities BUT in the same God who works in us all. #### OUR FAITH ACTIVE IN OUR FINANCIAL GIVING – AS OF JUNE 30

A number of folks continue to ask how we are doing financially as a congregational family, now fourplus months into this strange time of pandemic, with a worship life that continues to be very different from anything we have ever known and without most of our other in-person activities, and so Pastor Tom (the old accountant) has again prepared the following summary for Congregational Council and this *Epistle*.

First, regarding our Current Fund... (The Current Fund is our fund from which most day-to-day bills get paid, much like your home's checking account.) With exactly half of the year behind us as of June 30, to be right on **budget**, we would have received and spent half, or \$78,736 out of our total 2020 budget. Looking at our expenses for the first half of 2020, we have **spent** \$73,151, well under budget. Turning to our resources coming in, and adjusting down the total funds we have received for the effects of some very kind whole-year offerings made at the very beginning of the year, we have **received** \$74,540 in true June 30 offerings and other income, meaning that we have more than covered our actual expenses, but that we have a **shortfall in comparison to budget of** (\$4,196). (This is in fact not the worst result we have ever had in comparison to budget at this point in the year, with two previous years where we had a bigger shortfall and several other "normal" years where we weren't very much ahead of this year.) So, considering this new reality with which we are all living of "no offering plates", we are definitely holding our own!

As to the Children & Youth Ministry Fund, through which Miss Laurie's ministry is funded, we have received <u>\$10,201</u> in offerings and Thrivent Choice Dollars as of the end of June (again adjusting for some whole-year gifts kindly shared at the beginning of the year), which is a **shortfall of (\$1,786)** from our budget goal at the half-way point of the year. Considering the fact that this is the first year in which we are challenging ourselves with a budget goal that doesn't include any support from any other congregational funds, and of course the realities of these COVID-19 times, here too we are holding our own.

Finally, as to the gifts we share with our Lower Susquehanna Synod and our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be exactly on **budget** as of June 30, we would have received and forwarded half of our total \$12,000 commitment or **\$6,000**. As of June 30, we have **actually received and shared** an adjusted total of **\$4,300**, meaning that we are **behind** our commitment by **(\$1,700)**.

Thank you for your partnership in the ministry of St. John, and especially for your kindness in "going the extra mile" to mail or drop off your offerings in these challenging times! Please watch for future updates every few months, and please feel free at any time to ask questions of or share ideas with Treasurer Jamie Doyle, Pastor Tom or any member of Council.

#### St John Evangelical Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes Special Meeting Regarding COVID 19 and Flooring Project June 14, 2020

**Minutes:** Motion by Ron Erb and seconded by Dan Maurer to accept the May minutes. Motion approved unanimously.

**Flooring Project:** The flooring committee consisting of Lois Watson, Helen Henninger, Ken Koller, and Sandra Lamenza reviewed options and presented a final selection to the property committee. The total cost is \$9973.00. We have \$4390.00 already submitted, and an additional \$2000.00 in pledges. Pastor will make an announcement requesting additional donations. The remaining balance will be taken from the interest money from the Memorial Account. Sandra Lamenza made a motion on behalf of the committee to approve the project. It was seconded by Dan Maurer. Motion approved unanimously.

**COVID 19:** Pastor Tom reported on the successful Zoom services and proposed that we start having inperson services in the pavilion where we can safely socially distance. These 11:00AM services would be in addition to the 9:30AM Zoom service and would require masks. Attendees will be requested to bring their own chairs. Folding chairs, masks and disinfecting spray will be available for those who may forget. The attendance will be limited to 25 the first week until we see how easily we can space ourselves under the pavilion. Communion would be offered on the normal schedule for communion. Motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Heidi Lehman to start the outdoor services on June 28. Motion approved unanimously.

Roy Henry reported on the research he has been doing in preparation for live streaming indoor services. More information will be provided at the next meeting.

The plan is to continue the outdoor services through September 13 at which time a decision will be made about moving services indoors.


