Pastoral Acts

At Graveside

Pastor Tom presided at funeral worship on July 23 for **Marie Farner**, who died at her Halifax-area home on July 13, where she had been on hospice care. Worship began at St. Peter Lutheran, Rt. 225 Halifax, which had been Marie's congregational home for many years, and ended at St. John (where Marie had begun her faith journey in baptism and to which she returned for the end of that journey) at graveside in our cemetery. We pray God's comfort in the promise of the Resurrection of Jesus for Marie's family members and other loved ones!

Our Faith Active in Our Financial Giving - as of June 30

After concluding the year 2020 with very strong giving of tithes and offerings, despite all of the COVID-related impacts to our congregational family life together, the first half of 2021 has continued to see us all pulling together in very solid fashion in giving to God's work in this place as a congregational family. Here are summaries of our three largest funds for the first six months of 2021 – the **Current Fund** (much like your main checking account at home, from which most of the day-to-day bills of ministry get paid), the **Children & Youth (C&Y) Fund** (through which Miss Laurie's ministry is funded), and our **Larger Church Benevolence** (through which our congregational family supports the work of our Lower Susquehanna Synod and Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on all of our behalf):

- * Our Total Giving reflects the kindness of several folks who shared all of their 2021 offerings right at the beginning of the year. The "Adjusted" line subtracts out the ½ of these advance gifts which applies to the months July through December still to come.
- ^ With our Larger Church Benevolence, we simply send on exactly what we receive each month, and so the Total "Expenses" equal the Total Giving.

The above information is based on a summary which Pastor Tom (putting on his "CPA Hat") shares each month with Congregational Council. Please don't hesitate to ask him any questions you might have about these numbers. For questions about the details of our giving or our expenses, please speak with **Treasurer Jamie Doyle**. Thank you for your partnership in this wonderful ministry which is St. John! Please watch for future updates every few months. (And please remember that, if you are not able for any reason to take part in inperson worship, there are three very simple options for giving your tithes and offerings. You are welcome to **1**. mail your offering to the church (PO Box 270, Berrysburg, 17005-0270) or **2**. drop it by the church and place it in the red plastic tub that is prominently visible in the Sunday School Room, on the table just outside Pastor Tom's office door. In addition, **3**. if neither of those is easily done, you may wish to contact your bank about setting up an automatic payment, as some of our congregational family members also have done, whereby the offering you direct is sent by your bank as a check mailed directly to the church. In all cases, Pastor Tom will then see that all offerings received get securely passed along to our counters.)

As we look back on this year's Annual Strawberry Festival, held June 9 after a first-ever year "away", it was easily the most unusual Festival since the modern event was reconstituted in 1976. We were dealing with a take-out only format never before attempted – this a last-minute change (as COVID realities were quickly changing) from an initially-planned drive through only format, also never before attempted. This meant the loss

of many of the parts of the normal onsite event that draw people each year, such as musical entertainment. And then, to top it all off, we were faced with one of the more difficult weather days we have had, with rain and wind which saw pop-up tents and shelters carried aloft and, in at least one case, destroyed. Through it all, the St. John congregational family persevered, our community turned out to support our efforts, and, most importantly, God blessed us with joyful fellowship, safety, and monies received which, when all was said and done, totaled \$18,073.00 (understandably about \$8,000 less than the 2019 all-time record total). Deducting our total expenses of \$9,925.24 (which were only \$500 or so less than in a typical year because, even as we saved on expenses like entertainment, we incurred brand new expenses for things like many more take-out containers), left us with net proceeds of \$8,147.76, which were less than 2019's record by about \$7,500. This \$8,000+ added to the "Bicentennial"/Strawberry Festival Fund represents a whole lot of important ministry which could not be taking place in the next year were it not for the efforts of all who helped in any way. THANK YOU ALL!!

And looking ahead to 2022: Please mark your family calendars for next year's Festival, already scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 8</u>. Also, the first planning meeting for next year's Festival, open to all interested persons, will be held on Tuesday, March 1, beginning at 7:00 P.M. at the church.

And Continuing with the Theme of Thankfulness...

A big thank you to **Sheila Barder** and **Camie Leitzel** for coordinating this year's Yard Sale to Benefit Lutheran Disaster Response, which ended up raising a total of **\$1,207.50**, all of which will be sent on to help in Jesus' Name those who are victims of natural or human-created disasters. Camie and Sheila, in turn, would like to express their thankfulness to the congregational family for all of the really nice and saleable items which were donated this year and for all of the other support of their efforts, including all those who turned out on Monday, August 2, to help with the packing up and delivering of the leftovers. As Sheila and Camie expressed it, that clean-up was wrapped up in record time! ONCE AGAIN, THANK YOU ALL!!

Motion made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Matt Williard to accept the pastor's requested vacation time. Motion approved unanimously. Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Michael Henninger to accept the pastor's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Children and Youth Ministry Report: Motion was made by Sandra Lamenza and seconded by Michael Henninger to accept Miss Laurie's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made by Ron Erb and seconded by Michael Henninger to accept the treasurer's report. Motion approved unanimously.

Reports of Standing Committees:

Church Property: The committee reported that various projects have been completed. These include but are not limited to the pipe organ repair, steeple stars, emergency lighting, lawn tractor service, repairs at the sexton's house, and rain gutters on the pavilion. The replacement of the pavilion curtains will be completed before the Strawberry Festival.

New Business: The revised CDC COVID recommendation regarding mask wearing and social distancing was also discussed as it relates to worship services. A motion was made by Pastor Tom to follow the new guidelines. All vaccinated attendees will not be required to wear a mask. All social distancing signs and barriers will be removed. Worship will continue with Zoom as an option. Motion was seconded by Ron Erb. Motion approved unanimously. Pastor Tom requested that each council member reach out to some of the members on their call list to share the news of the change in restrictions and encourage them to return to worship services.

The next council meeting will include a lesson on ringing the bell as the ushers will take on the responsibility of ringing the bell before service begins.
