

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Jesus,

Even more than usual, the coming month of September is a time of transition in our congregational family life – as usual, from summer to autumn, but also this year a planned transition back to inside worship with the planned conclusion of *St. John Restoration 250*, along with continued scheduling and planning in our ongoing transition toward our apparent future of learning to co-exist with the reality of COVID.

With regard to our COVID transition, as I write these lines in mid-August, Dauphin County has just been downgraded to a *COVID-19 Community Level* of *Yellow/Medium*, with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention continuing to call for getting fully vaccinated and for wearing a mask 1. if you have COVID symptoms or 2. a positive test for COVID or 3. exposure to someone with COVID. (Better yet, our congregational family policy has been to ask that folks in any of these three categories please simply avoid in-person activities entirely and join in worship via Zoom.) In addition, those at high risk for severe illness are strongly encouraged to mask when indoors and masks are lifted up as a good additional protective measure for everyone at this time. Clearly, things are in flux, so please don't forget that there is still a tentativeness to all of our plans, especially the further we get into the new month. Be sure to keep an eye out for Miss Laurie's and my weekly emails as well as our weekly bulletins for the latest updates. (And Youth Group members – please be sure to watch your inbox for Olivia's update emails!) Here are our Sunday plans for the new month:

Sunday, September 4

We will be following our summer schedule on this holiday weekend, worshipping outdoors in the beauty of our pavilion, and sharing in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Sunday, September 11

As we gather once again outdoors in our grove pavilion, I will lead a combined Adult Bible Study on our summer schedule, from 8:45am to 9:15am. Our 9:30am worship will be a "SONDay Celebration" worship as we prepare to transition back to our fall schedule, including a *Sunny Sermon* by Miss Laurie, a *Food Truck Party: We've "On a Roll" with God* VBS slideshow, and our *Annual Blessing of the Backpacks & Devices* led by Pastor Tom (for which all students – Preschool through Grade 12 – are asked to bring along their school backpacks (or devices) for a time of recognition, blessing, and prayer, as a new school year gets underway). When our worship ends at 10:30am, it will be time to head out for our congregational outing to Knoebel's, where everyone attending will gather with their covered dish and container of drink for sharing to join in lunch together, followed by plenty of time for riding. Our younger members will have some ride tickets provided.

Sunday, September 18

As per our annual practice, we will return to our "rest of the year" Sunday morning schedule, but with a twist this year. Faith Formation activities for all ages will return to 9:00am, including Adult Bible Study, Youth Group Bible Time, and SONDay Celebration with Miss Laurie. And worship will follow at 10:15am, but outdoors in our beautiful pavilion one final planned time as St John Restoration 250 wraps up.

Sunday, September 25

Our 10:15am worship will be planned as our very first time back inside and upstairs following the completion of St John Restoration 250!

Thank you for reading and, especially, thank you in advance for your willingness to continue to "roll" with things!


News from Miss Laurie, Young Christians Minister

Confirmation Classes

On Sunday morning, September 25, those baptized members of St. John who are in at least 7th Grade and who have not yet been confirmed will begin a new year of study with Pastor Tom. The focus this year will be a close-up look at the Bible and what it contains, both Old and New Testaments. Two of our young members will be in their second of two years of study, leading toward their Confirmation next year on the Day of Pentecost, while six other young persons will begin a first year of study.

Greeter and Usher Ministries

As part of our planned "return to normal" in October, we are looking to re-start our Sunday morning Greeter and Usher ministries.

- Greeters are the folks who, as the name suggests, say a first warm "hello" to those arriving for worship. In addition, they are there to point the way (to the restroom, upstairs for worship, etc.) for those who may be entering those doors for the first time. Greeters are posted in the foyer, just inside the main doors, ideally by no later than 10:00am. Greeter(s) on a given Sunday morning may be an individual, a couple or other team of two, or an entire family of three or more. Louise Baumgardner and Lois Watson will be preparing a Greeter schedule for distribution to everyone who is willing to serve, but it is absolutely no problem if an assigned Sunday morning won't work for those assigned. Simply contact another nearby Sunday's Greeter(s) and arrange a swap, and then please let Pastor Tom and Rachel (if in time to update the bulletin) know about the change.
- Ushers typically work in teams of four for the Sundays in a given month, under the guidance of that month's Head Usher, who is a member of Congregational Council. Before worship, ideally no later than 10:00, one usher is stationed at the elevator door to welcome those arriving that way and help with any elevator questions, while the others are posted upstairs to distribute bulletins and help with any other needs. In "normal" times, the usher team receives the morning offering and works together on Holy Communion Sundays to guide everyone forward to the altar and back. Persons who would be new to this ministry would receive orientation from the Head Usher prior to their service. Here again, if an Usher cannot serve on an assigned Sunday, they simply notify the Head Usher and a swap/coverage is arranged.

If you would be interested in serving in either or both of these important ministries of hospitality, whether or not you ever have before, please contact Pastor Tom, who will be happy to answer any questions and who will then pass your name along for scheduling.

Our Faith Active in Our Financial Giving – As of June 30

After concluding the past two years with very strong giving of tithes and offerings, despite all of the COVID-related impacts to our congregational family life together, the first half of 2022 has likewise seen us all pulling together in solid fashion in giving to God's work in this place as a congregational family, and this in addition to the special giving response to our **St John Restoration 250** project! Here are summaries of our three largest funds for the first six months of 2022 – the **Current Fund** (much like your main checking account at home, from which most of the day-to-day bills of ministry get paid), the **Children & Youth (C&Y) Fund** (through which Miss Laurie's ministry is funded), and our **Larger Church Benevolence** (through which our congregational family supports the work of our Lower Susquehanna Synod and Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on all of our behalf). It is worth noting that our Current Fund giving in comparison to our budgeted figure is one of our strongest ever as we enter into the "summer doldrums":

^{*}Our June 30 Total Giving reflects the kindness of several folks who shared all of their 2022 offerings right at the beginning of the year. The "Adjusted" line subtracts out the half of these advance gifts which applies to the final six months of the year still to come.

[^]With our Larger Church Benevolence, we simply send on exactly what we receive each month, and so the Total "Expenses" always equal the Total Giving.

Still on the Theme of Thanksgiving for Faithful Financial Stewardship....

As we look back on our Annual Strawberry Festival, held June 8, the final financial report confirms what we experienced that day here on The Hill – that it was indeed a "return to normal" in terms of support and participation, leading to, as reported during worship on July 17, close-to-record total receipts for the day of \$25,714.15. Deducting our total expenses of \$10,956.14 left us with our second-highest-ever net proceeds of \$14,758.01, which were added to the "Bicentennial"/Strawberry Festival Fund. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way to make our "return to normal" Strawberry Festival another wonderful success!

And looking ahead to 2023: Please mark your family calendars for next year's Festival, already scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 14</u>. Also, the first planning meeting for next year's Festival, open to all interested persons, will be held on Tuesday, March 7, beginning at 7:00 P.M. at the church.

First Aid and Preparedness News

St. John's has recently acquired some new (to us) first aid supplies. We now have a Philips HeartStart FRx AED (automatic external defibrillator), a bleeding control kit, and an evacuation chair.

On Sunday, July 10, approximately a dozen people attended an AED familiarization session conducted by Courtney and Rob Foreman and Gary Daniels. The intent was to allay/dispel fear, boost confidence, and get as up close and personal as possible to the device. There were good questions asked and good comments/suggestions made. The next step will be to arrange a CPR/AED class in the near future. Stay tuned for further information.

Some things to think about with our AED: First, it is a small package (roughly 2.5"x6"x7") but it will deliver enough energy to reverse ventricular fibrillation, which is a hallmark of sudden cardiac arrest. Second, the battery pack is powerful enough to deliver up to 200 shocks. This is quite an improvement over earlier technology. Third, our AED can be used on adult, child, or infant victims. For a child eight years old or younger and /or 55 pounds or less, there is a key in the pouch on the lid of the unit. Insert the key in the slot, and less energy is delivered, but still enough to resuscitate the victim.

Finally, a few thoughts on maintenance and upkeep. The device automatically and remotely does daily, weekly, and monthly self-checks. You will know it is "ready for use" by looking into a small window in the upper right corner of the device. A green light will blink, about once every two to three seconds. If you need further assurance or encouragement, there is a small blue "i button" below the main power button on the front of the device. Press that, and it should tell you that it is "ready for use." If the machine is chirping, press that "i button" to find out what the problem might be. The owner's manual lists several possibilities and associated remedies that should fix the problem. DO NOT remove-and-replace the battery pack unless prompted. This reduces battery power and life and may deplete the battery prematurely. DO NOT open the case with the AED pads unless you intend to use them. This interferes with the device self-check, and it will assume it is being used.

The AED has been deployed for a little more than a month, for worship services and other events. There is a wall cabinet for it, and when our renovations are complete, the cabinet will be mounted somewhere obvious and accessible, and the AED will be ready to go when needed.

- 1. Counter-signed checks are no longer accepted by *Mid Penn Bank*, and so all checks must be made payable to "St. John Church", no endorsing a check over to the church.
- 2. **Please** feel free to write a single check even if it's for multiple envelopes or purposes.
- 3. Please no staples or tape on your checks or envelopes.
- 4. Please write clearly on your envelopes. (If no designations are made, enclosed offering will go to Current Fund.)
- 5. For **Restoration 250** contributions, if no Memorial is designated, the amount will appear on your year-end Giving Statement.
 - If a Memorial is included, the amount will not appear on your year-end Giving Statement and your "Thank You" note will instead serve as your receipt for tax purposes.

Amazon Shoppers

If you are an Amazon.com shopper, our congregation is registered with the "Amazon Smiles" program, whereby Amazon donates one half of one percent of your purchase amount to a charitable organization that you select. Please note that, to qualify, your purchase has to be made through the "smile" side of things, to which you will find a very easily identifiable link from the main part of the Amazon.com website. (Once there, it can be a bit tricky to pick out our congregational name from all of the "St. John's" – look for **St John Evangelical Lutheran Church, Berrysburg, PA**. Once you have selected us the first time, we will automatically be designated each time you shop and you won't need to re-do the search.) All monies received in this way will be automatically deposited for use in the Current Fund.
